On behalf of the Colorado Water Congress, we are writing in support of H.R. 807, the Water and Agriculture Tax Reform, in the 116th Congress. The Colorado Water Congress is a membership organization consisting of over 400 members, serving as the principal voice of Colorado's water community.

The Colorado Water Congress' members represent the municipal, agricultural, industrial, commercial, recreation, and environmental sectors. This legislation would help support Colorado economies, address the rising cost of water, and assist in the facilitation of improving and updating aging water infrastructure. By allowing mutual storage and delivery companies to maintain their tax-exempt status, many of our members would continue to deliver a necessary resource to Coloradans.
